New Electronic Gate to be Installed at Two Harbors

AVALON – A taller electronic gate is scheduled to be installed at the Two Harbors entrance to Catalina’s wildlands on Friday, weather permitting, to prevent the Island’s deer and iconic bison straying into the campgrounds and other public spaces at Two Harbors.

In case of rain, the installation will be delayed. The electronic gate system will be a duplicate of the Hogsback Gate used to access the Island’s interior from Avalon. The same access cards used at the Hogsback Gate will work at the new Two Harbors gate.

Two Harbors residents with vehicles who do not currently have a road permit from the Catalina Island Conservancy will need to obtain one to enter and exit the interior at Two Harbors. To obtain a permit, please contact the Conservancy at 310-510-1445.

About the Conservancy

Formed in 1972, the Catalina Island Conservancy is one of California's oldest land trusts. Its mission is to be a responsible steward of its lands through a balance of conservation, education and recreation. Through its ongoing efforts, the Conservancy protects the magnificent natural and cultural heritage of Santa Catalina Island, stewarding approximately 42,000 acres of land and more than 60 miles of rugged shoreline. It provides an airport and 50 miles of biking and nearly 150 miles of hiking opportunities within its road and trail system. The Conservancy conducts educational outreach through two nature centers, its Wrigley Memorial & Botanic Garden and guided experiences in the Island’s rugged interior. Twenty miles from the mainland, the Island is a treasure trove of historical and archaeological sites. It also contains numerous rare and endangered animals and plants.
