### **Celebrate “Your Adventure Begins Here” at the 23rd Annual Catalina Island Conservancy Ball April 14 at the Avalon Casino Ballroom**

The event will also start the countdown to the anticipated opening of The Trailhead Visitor Center in Avalon later this year. The Trailhead will serve as the Conservancy’s new, prominently located visitors’ center where adventure on Catalina Island begins for everyone.

“This year’s Conservancy Ball will also focus on the many adventures available on the Island—from breathtaking hikes to exciting Eco Tours of the interior,” said Tony Budrovich, Conservancy president and CEO. “We are working hard to create the best possible backyard for Avalon residents and visitors of Catalina to explore and experience.”

Guests will be treated to dinner, enjoy big band sounds of Society Beat and will have the opportunity to bid on many one-of-a-kind items during the silent and live auctions. Proceeds from the Ball are used to support the Conservancy’s vital conservation, education and recreation programming on Catalina Island.

Formed in 1972, the Catalina Island Conservancy is one of California's oldest land trusts. Its mission is to be a responsible steward of its lands through a balance of conservation, education and recreation. Through its ongoing efforts, the Conservancy protects the magnificent natural and cultural heritage of Santa Catalina Island, stewarding approximately 42,000 acres of land and more than 60 miles of rugged shoreline. It provides an airport and 50 miles of biking and nearly 150 miles of hiking opportunities within its road and trail system. The Conservancy conducts

educational outreach through two nature centers, its Wrigley Memorial & Botanic Garden and guided experiences in the Island's rugged interior. Twenty miles from the mainland, the Island is a treasure trove of historical and archaeological sites. It also contains numerous rare and endangered animals and plants.
