Although numerous frequency categories are listed by Thorne, these have been distilled down to the four basic categories that he defines. Family and species names have been updated to those of *The Jepson Manual* (Hickman 1993). Name changes that have been published since that date have been further updated, as with *Quercus pacifica*.
